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Teach middle schoolers good note-taking practices by modeling a T-chart. Taking notes in class. Writing at the speed of speech can be daunting even for an adult. These tips may help your student as he develops his own system: Start a new page for each new class each day. Date it. Leave space between topics or ideas so you can scan the page more easily later. Take down key words and concepts, not sentences.
