

## The Kings Mother Lady Margaret Beaufort Countess Of Richmond And Derby

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Margaret was instrumental in secretly conspiring against King Richard III and one if not the driving force to overthrow the king. After her son won the crown at Bosworth Field, Margaret was referred to in court as "My Lady the King's Mother."

Nevertheless, Margaret almost immediately adopted semi-regal status. She was referred to throughout Henry ' s reign as ' my lady, the King ' s mother ' as well as by her titles of Countess of Richmond and Derby. Around the end of the century, she even took to signing her documents Margaret R, rather than the more usual noble style which would have been M Richmond.

Henry VII and Elizabeth of York Henry VII was the only child of Edmund Tudor, Earl of Richmond (son of Henry V's widow Catherine de Valois and Owen Tudor) and his 13-year old wife Lady Margaret Beaufort (who died in the Abbot of Westminster's house on 29th June 1509, shortly after Henry VIII ' s coronation, and was buried in the Abbey).
